Agnes Lossie was born June 23, 1925 in the Big Cove community on the Qualla Boundary, lands owned by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians. In 1937, while she was still a schoolgirl, she learned to make baskets from Lottie Stamper.For 30 years, Lottie Queen Stamper (1907-1987) taught hundreds of girls how to weave baskets.
